Attendance



Our attendance is well below our target of 95%. We understand that there can be illnesses in families however communication is key to ensuring we don't have to spend a lot of time following up or having to refer to other agencies. We have a number of ways in which you can

Late arrivals and early pick ups

Just a reminder that late arrivals are required to sign in at the front office. Students will then be given a pink slip to take to the teacher so they know they have been added as late in the roll. If this does not occur students may be left as absent, unexplained.

If you are needing to pick up your child early, please come to the front office and your child's class will be rung and them sent down to the office. As you can appreciate, we do not want to have adults wandering around the school and children going without signing out correctly.

NAPI AN

This year NAPLAN testing will occur earlier in the year than usual, the NAPLAN 9-day test period will be in Week 7, Term 1 – Wednesday 15 March until Monday 27 March 2023. Moving NAPLAN to term 1 will allow schools to access their students' results earlier in the school year, helping teachers to better identify what support students may need and giving teachers greater opportunities to adjust teaching and learning during the year.

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS cont...

From this year onwards, each students NAPLAN report will show how they are tracking against 4 levels of achievement, known as proficiency standards. These will replace the previous 10 NAPLAN bands.

The standards are:

- Exceeding
- Strong
- Developing
- Needs additional support

The standards are set at a challenging but reasonable standard of literacy and numeracy expected for the child at the time of testing. Reporting will include clear descriptions for teachers and families about student progress against these levels of achievement. Those descriptions will be developed by expert teachers. More information about changes to NAPLAN will be provided in the coming weeks.

Berry Street Educational Model

At the end of week 3 we had our first day of training in BSEM. We know in today's changing world, many primary and secondary school students encounter daily challenges that can impact their success at school. Despite best efforts and intentions, schools often require specialised strategies to address student needs for healing, growth, and achievement.

BSEM equips schools with strategies to facilitate students' cognitive and behavioural change, thereby increasing student engagement to significantly progress their academic achievement. The program is informed by the last 25 years of trauma-informed practice, wellbeing practice, positive psychology and the science of learning research.

Material & Service Fees 2023



The M&S Fees for 2023 has been set at \$269.00. However the State Government has announced a \$100.00 rebate which brings the fee down to \$169.00 per child. School card eligible families will not receive this rebate.

Invoices have been sent to families via post and have all the vital information required on how to apply for School Card or how to arrange a regular payment plan.

Debt proceedings will commence in Term 2, so to avoid this from happening, please see admin staff if you have any difficulties paying the fees by the due date.

Payments can be made via the QKR app, direct credit into our bank account (see staff for details), cash or card.

Due date for payment of the fees is Friday 14th April 2023.

School Card applications must be applied for every year and submitted ONLINE for 2023.

If you need access or support to assist you with your application, please see the admin staff who will help you. Don't forget to bring your CRN number with you.

School Card applications should to be lodged before the end of Term 1 2023.



Hi everyone, my name is Nick Dodd and I am the Pastoral Care Worker (PCW) at Craigmore South Primary. I have been at Craigmore South for a year now and it has been fantastic getting to know everyone.

A big part of my role is to be a friendly, caring and trusting person in the school environment, but it could also include supporting students to remain engaged in the classroom, opportunities for mentoring and providing social, emotional and spiritual support to students, staff and families.



I also have the Activity Room open at recess on Wednesdays for children to visit and join in with board games, drawing and sometimes a special craft activity. I have a picture of myself on the door of my office and this changes weekly. Many of the kids like to come past and see who or what I am each week!

We will be continuing with our Wellbeing Agents program which began last year, with Student Reps from each classroom. The Wellbeing Agents are chosen by their class peers and will be participating in an ongoing anti-bullying program. The program will equip them with knowledge and confidence to support other students who may be feeling unsafe or left-out at play times due to being teased or bullied.

Craigmore South has also begun receiving "The One Box", which is a box of seasonal fruit & vegetables, 2 litre milk and loaf of bread. The box is available every school week as an extra support to some families. We are currently at capacity with this program for 2023 but are hoping to increase the number of boxes available in 2024.

I am at school on Wednesdays and Fridays where you will usually find me in the yard at lunch and recess, in the Activity Room or helping out in a classroom. I am available to parents and families for a chat from 9-9:45 am on Fridays.
