NAPLAN

Congratulations to our year 3 and 5 students who undertook the NAPLAN testing over the past few weeks. The students participated in a writing, reading, language conventions (grammar and spelling) and numeracy test. All of the students made us so proud with the effort they put in throughout the testing process. Families will be notified of the results later on in the year.

Parent teacher interviews

Behaviour

Site Improvement Planning - Reading R -2

Every morning from 9:00 – 9:50 all of our students in years R – 2 are involved in a very explicit synthetic phonics lesson. The students are grouped according to their knowledge and understanding, and each session involves targeted teaching to enable all learners to progress. Each of the teachers follow an instructional routine that entails 5 essential skills, These skills are learning the letter sounds, learning letter formation, blending, identifying sounds in words and tricky words.

All of the teachers use another program called Heggerty to support skills needed to be successful in reading. The Heggerty Curriculum includes explicit instruction in the following phonological and phonemic awareness skills:

- Rhyming
- Initial Phoneme Isolation
- Blending
- Isolating final and medial phonemes (sounds)
- Seamenting
- Adding Phonemes
- Deleting Phonemes
- Substituting Phonemes

Despite there being just 26 letters in the English language there are approximately 44 unique sounds, also known as phonemes, that students need to know to be successful readers and writers. Various letters and letter combinations known as graphemes are used to represent the sounds.

MINDFULNESS

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Our class has been using movement and stretching as a strategy to take a break and refocus. The students really enjoyed it and they also enjoyed identifying the muscles in their body they felt were stretching during these activities.







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PHONICS

In Phonics we have been focussing on "Parsing". Parsing is being able to identify parts of speech in sentences. The students have enjoyed trying to identify nouns and verbs in sentences.





MATH5

This term in maths we have been looking at identifying odd and even numbers, place value as well as developing efficient strategies, including skip counting, when counting large amounts of objects. The students have also enjoyed using our "Exit Tickets", which allows them to explain their thinking for our maths topics / concepts.

Mrs McLean's Year 3/4's

School values: In the first few weeks of school the students had a focus on the school values and learning to develop integrity and collaboration even with people who weren't within their friendship group. One activity saw the students being blindfolded, listening to their partner who tried to guide them safely through the maze of cones from start to finish. Students realised how important successful communication and questioning was to achieve the set goal.







Maths: The class have been using a range of manipulatives and engagement games to help develop their reasoning, understanding and problem-solving skills when using place value.











Auslan: Students have embraced learning the basics in Auslan. They have learnt to finger spell the alphabet and basic words and begun to recognise and use particular signs to represent words instead of spelling them. They are able to introduce themselves and ask for someone else's name in response.

Material & Service Fees 2023



The M&S Fees for 2023 has been set at \$269.00. However the State Government has announced a \$100.00 rebate which brings the fee down to \$169.00 per child. School card eligible families will not receive this rebate.

Invoices have been sent to families via post and have all the vital information required on how to apply for School Card or how to arrange a regular payment plan.

Debt proceedings will commence in Term 2, so to avoid this from happening, please see admin staff if you have any difficulties paying the fees by the due date.

Payments can be made via the QKR app, direct credit into our bank account (see staff for details), cash or card.

Due date for payment of the fees is Friday 14th April 2023.

School Card applications must be applied for every year and submitted ONLINE for 2023.

Sports Vouchers program

The Sports Vouchers program is a Government of South Australia initiative administered by the Office for Recreation and Sport. The program provides an opportunity for primary school aged children from Reception to Year 7 to receive up to a \$50 discount on sports

membership/registration fees. The purpose is to increase the number of children playing organised sport by reducing cost as a barrier to participate in sport.
