We have been using baselines, making sure that the units are the same and not leaving any gaps or overlapping the units.


We also had a lot of fun learning about the amazing Chameleon, which catches its food with a long, fast sticky tongue which is twice the length of its body!

We measured our length with streamers, then doubled it, and found out!








In Mr. Stubbin's class we have been learning how to recognise, make and continue different patterns. We have made AB, ABC, ABB, AAB patterns and many, many more!




Keeley: I made a pink, yellow, pink, yellow pattern.

Aboriginal Education at CSPS

During Term 2, all students have engaged in learning about Aboriginal perspectives within their classroom. It has been great to see students learning about Reconciliation Week, displaying work at assembly, and sharing their learning with other students and staff.




R-2 Deadly Learners group displaying the banner titled "Working Together, Walking Together", created in recognition of Reconciliation Week 2023.

We have been holding small group lessons with Aboriginal students at the school, called the Deadly Learners group, on Friday afternoons throughout the term. During the term, we learnt about the "Effects of colonisation on culture and the impact it has on our Future: Pre-Colonisation, Colonisation, Reconciliation and Future", based on the Australian Curriculum's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Cross Curriculum Priorities.

In Week 1, we were fortunate enough to have in incursion with Iteka from Kumarninthi, who spoke to all of the students in the Deadly Learners group about Aboriginal culture in and around the Adelaide region, the importance of identity and family in an Aboriginal context, and discussed some tools and artefacts used by Indigenous Australians. Throughout the term, we explored texts that related to the impact that colonisation had on Aboriginal people, and how we are all working together to make Australia a better place for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians. Such texts included the books "Sorry, Sorry", "Maralinga" and the "Papunya School Book of Country and History", In Week 5, in recognition of Reconciliation Week, Tyra worked with a number of students to complete an art piece (displayed in the front office), showing how both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal students and staff are "working together and walking together" to make Craigmore South a great primary school for all to work, learn and play.



In Week 3, we had Scott Rathman from Rusted Tin Contemporary Aboriginal Arts work with groups of students in artist workshops. The students discussed the themes with Scott and displayed their ideas of what symbols could be incorporated into the artworks. The themes included: Community, the Learning Journey, and Belonging. In Week 5, during Reconciliation Week, we sold donuts that were decorated with the Aboriginal flag from the Vili's Family Bakery. We would like to thank everyone who purchased donuts during this time, as 50 cents from the sale of each donut was given to the Tjindu Foundation by Vili's. We ended up selling 250 donuts!

During Week 10, some classes will be participating in learning about the significance of NAIDOC Week, and the importance that it holds within the First Nations communities. We would like to thank all staff, students and families in supporting the Aboriginal Education Team at Craigmore South Primary School in making the school a more inclusive and positive learning environment for all to learn and play on Kaurna land.



WELL BEING HUB CREW

I have spent terms 1 & 2 as a social work student on placement at Craigmore South Primary School. During this time, I have facilitated one-on-one sessions with students, and a weekly group session. It has been so fulfilling to support students in their social and emotional well-being. I have learnt so much about the importance of well-being in child development, and how greatly it impacts student learning outcomes and their ability to overcome barriers. I am grateful to the leadership team for their guidance and support in my learning over the last few months. From one-on-one wellbeing sessions, to dance parties at lunch, I have enjoyed every moment spent with the staff and students.

Zizhu:

During my second placement, I have become familiar with working in a school environment and enjoy absorbing relevant social work knowledge and skills to support my professional work. Moreover, I appreciate the staff of Craigmore South Primary School who provided a safe and harmonious workplace where I can learn and practice my professional skills. In the past five months, I have been running lunch activities, including drawing, mindful movement, and origami activities which consistently create a comfortable and safe space for supporting children and young people's mental health and well-being. Meanwhile, periodically attending the Kids' Club (including independently running it by myself for one session) improves my organising skills in working with groups of people. Additionally, with weekly individual sessions with students who need extra support, I gradually built trust and rapport with them, which stimulates them to confide in me when they face difficult situations. Throughout the therapeutic sessions, children are more likely to express their thoughts and concerns and use strategies to manage their emotions.

Mackala:

I have enjoyed my time at Craigmore South Primary School this past semester working alongside staff and enjoying my time engaging with the students. I have run 2 lunch activities a week, alongside another social work student, for all students to come and enjoy. We had games club, where we had many different board games to enjoy, mindful movement, where we engaged in yoga and later changed that to origami club which was very enjoyed by all students. I have been working with students in 1:1 sessions to help build their social skills, emotional regulation, and self-esteem as well as assisting with facilitating Kid's Club, a social skills club, run twice a week after school.

Millie:

Throughout the past two school terms of doing my placement at Craigmore South Primary School I have thoroughly enjoyed my time with the staff and students. I have learned many new skills and have been able to practice old ones. The staff have been very welcoming and have made being a part of this school a very positive one. The students have also been a very positive part of this experience. During my placement, I have had weekly 1:1 therapeutic sessions with students in the hub where I try to create a safe space for them to talk about anything and more importantly, build a trusting and respectful relationship with them. We focus the session on play therapy as it is important to communicate with children using their language. I have engaged with facilitating two lunchtime activities each week (drawing club and dance club) with another member of the hub and also helping in facilitating Kids Club twice a week.

João:

Craigmore South Primary School has provided an enjoyable experience as part of my final placement as a social work student. Working with children in both 1:1 and group sessions has been rewarding, as I could apply theory into practice and develop my communication skills. Also, I have been involved in two lunch clubs (Games Club and Dance Club) and have provided amusing moments for most students. It is gratifying when they ask me around the school when those clubs will happen again. Moreover, I have emotionally supported children enrolled on the Family and Child Wellbeing Network from NACYS, using play therapy and developing a therapeutic relationship with them. Since February, I have been accompanying their progress throughout the hub sessions, which is fulfilling and makes me want to continue working with children.
