IMPORTANT FINANCE NEWS

Material & Service Fees 2023

Your child's Material & Service Fees were due on April 7th 2023.



All outstanding invoices have now been forwarded to Central Debt Recovery.

Once DfE Recovery Service processes the school's claims you will not be able to pay your fees here at school and it will be more difficult for you to organise payments.

Please consider this fact for 2024 and organise a payment plan with us if you have difficulty paying. Small weekly/fortnightly payments are welcome.

Material & Service Fees 2024

Final approval of the School Material and Service Charges was approved at the Governing Council Meeting 23rd October 2023.

The M&S Fees for 2024 will be \$287.00 which is an increase of \$18.00. The M&S Fees also incorporate the Reception to Year 5's swimming fees. The Year 6 component assists with the Camp subsidy.

Please Note: If your child/ren do not attend the swimming or camp the component of M&S will still be used to support these activities.

Invoices will be sent home early next year.

School Card applications must be applied for every year and submitted ONLINE.

2024 will be available from late January.

No paper applications will be accepted by the Department except for Change of Circumstances, Hardship or Reassessment.

To assist you with your online application a staff member will be available at the front office from the 29th January 2024.

This support will continue throughout term 1.

Please ensure you bring your Centrelink details (CRN numbers) with you.

We understand some parents do not have access to technology or have limited

AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

HEALTH, PE, SCIENCE

This term for Health we have been learning about goal setting; learning to set short and long-term learning goals that we can achieve in the upcoming weeks. We have also revisited our sun smart unit, going through our sun safety with our 5's of slip, slop, slap, seek, and slide and the reminder of wearing our hats out in the yard to protect ourselves during the warmer months in the lead up to summer.

In PE we have been participating in the Yulunga Indigenous games playing different variety of games involving running and dodging, ball rolling and aiming at a target and striking and fielding. This gave us the opportunity to learn about Aboriginal culture through the background stories of language and vocabulary that are explained before each game.

In science, we kicked off the term with chemical science in the form of a Coke and Mentos experiment which we loved. We have welcomed a new addition to science, our stick insects as our living thing in the science room. We have been excited to be learning fascinating facts about the stick insects like their behaviour, diet, habitat and life cycle as part of our biological science unit.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES

This term in Digital Technologies, students have continued to develop their knowledge of programming/coding through the use of robots and programming apps such as Scratch, Scratch Jr and Codementum. The Year 5/6 students have also started to use HTML coding to build functional web sites. All students have continued to use Makers Empire and the 3D printers to create a variety of designs, even a new house for the class hermit crabs (designed by Thea M – Year 2)!

On Thursday 26th October, the Year 5/6 students were given the opportunity to participate in the Bright Future STEM program. The students listened to a guest speaker (experienced in the field of engineering) and then worked in groups to complete five different practical activities: Dr Eureka (science board game), Turing Tumbles (marble-powered computers), electrical circuits (snap-circuits), engineering mazes, and Virtual Reality.



Dad's Business delivers a range of inclusive activities for fathers in the Playford area. The program provides relaxed and non-judgmental group environments where dads can be themselves and share their experience of parenting.

The focus is on engaging dads in the lives and wellbeing of their children, and building parenting skills, confidence, cultural belonging, and a positive sense of self.

Program Aim

There is no one right way to be a father. Dad's Business will support you to find your way.

Dad's Business gives you the tools to:

- Recognise the value of fathers in family and children's lives
- Enhance wellbeing in fatherhood
- Connect with your children, be an involved parent, and have a positive influence on child development
- Strengthen the parent/child relationship
- Build a strong parenting team
 Develop positive family relationships to support children to reach their full potential
- Connect to community services and supports as required.

Target Group

Dad's Business works with fathers of children aged from o to 12 years, who live in the Playford region. Support is inclusive of all people who identify as a father including expectant and new fathers, stepfathers, and fathers whose children don't live with them.

Working with other services

Dad's Business activities provide the opportunity to link fathers and their family to their community and promote social connectedness. We will support you to connect with other services based on your individual needs.

Referrals

Fathers can be referred to Dad's Business by services, or they can self-refer by calling and speaking to the Dads and Fatherhood Worker. All fathers start out with an appointment to discuss their expectations, hopes and worries, and to find a support that is right for them.



What we do

Our courses run during the school term and offer a range of supports and parent education including:

Dads Time -One on One Support from the Dad's and Fatherhood worker for a range of fatherhood and men's topics. Need support and not sure where to turn, book an appointment now! (Bookings essential).

Circle of Security Parenting - Asix-week parenting course to help you understand your child's behaviour; help your child organise their feelings; help you enjoy a more fulfilling relationship with your child; and help your child feel secure now and into the future.

Seahorse - A six week course designed to provide expecting or new dads/fathers with skills to navigate the early stages of family life (best suited to those expecting or with children aged o-12months).

Bringing up great kids - A parenting program promoting respectful and caring relationships between fathers and their children. Learn parenting techniques which ensure your child/ren grow up happy and healthy.

Dads Plus - A six week course designed to provide all dads/fathers with children aged 0-12 years with the skills required to provide solid foundations and optimal growth for children and the entire family unit.

Dads and Fathers' Social Group- A weekly drop-in group held during school terms for dads to meet other dads in a relaxed non-judgmental environment. Discuss anything relating to family or personal wellbeing.


