Material & Service Fees 2024

The M&S Fees for 2024 will be **\$287.00** which is an increase of \$18.00. The M&S Fees also incorporate the Reception to Year 5's swimming fees. The Year 6 component assists with the Camp subsidy.

Please Note: If your child/ren do not attend the swimming or camp the component of M&S will still be used to support these activities.

Invoices have now been sent home.

School Card applications must be applied for every year and submitted ONLINE.

The 2024 School Card Application will be available from late January.

No paper applications will be accepted by the Department except for Change of Circumstances, Hardship or Reassessment.

To assist you with your **online** application a staff member will be available to support you to apply.

Please ensure you bring your Centrelink details (CRN numbers) with you.

We understand some parents do not have access to technology or have limited understanding of departmental procedures.

Please do not hesitate to use our access and support to ensure your School Card application is lodged and processed in a timely manner.

We would prefer that School Card applications be lodged before the end of Term 1 2024.

FROM OUR WELL BEING LEADER

Berry Street Education Model

We are in our second year of implementing the Berry Street Education Model. You should see some changes in our classrooms.

Morning Circles

Each morning begins with a morning circle, where students greet each other and are made to feel welcome. Teachers will share daily announcements, revisit the school values and classroom expectations. Students can share their morning routines from home and discuss if they are "ready to learn". Students are then given the opportunity to talk with an adult about strategies they can use if they are not ready for learning.

Calm Corners and sensory tools

Every classroom now has a dedicated space (usually with pillows or rugs) where students can go to help themselves regulate their emotions. In these calm corners are tools such as squeeze balls, weighted animals and other items they can use to focus their attention and calm their minds.

Brain breaks and positive primers

These are short movement or activity breaks within the day (usually every 30 minutes) to allow children to move and refocus their brains. We have found this helps to maintain students' (and teacher's) stamina for engagement in learning. Ask your child if they have a favourite activity.
