FROM OUR AUTISM INCLUSION TEACHER

My name is Hayley Mertin and I am the Autism Inclusion Teacher (AIT) at Craigmore South Primary School.

I am given one day a week in my AIT role to focus on strengthening our school community's inclusion of students on the autism spectrum.

The Department for Education provides an Autism Inclusion Multidisciplinary (AIM) team to support me in the AIT role. The team includes, senior advisor educators, developmental educator, psychologist, occupational therapist, speech pathologist and an Aboriginal cultural project officer. The information from the AIM team is evidence-based and informed by the autistic and autism community.

My role as an AIT is to pass on information, resources and training I receive from the AIM team to my colleagues. This term our focus is looking at the protective factor of school connectedness and the role positive peer relationships play in this. As the term continues, I will be seeking student and caregiver voice around Autism and Neurodivergence at school.
