## Mr Bond's class

## Term 1

## LITERACY

This term our class is learning how to write a persuasive text. We are focussing on the skills that individuals and businesses use to convince someone to change their mind or opinion about a topic or issue. We looked at the techniques used in advertising to convince a target audience to buy a product. The students had a go at using different advertising techniques to design their own advertisement for a product.


## NUMERACY

In maths we are developing our skills and confidence when using larger numbers. One of our challenges was to arrange the populations of our states and territories into either ascending or descending order. We also addressed some misconceptions the class had when working out which numbers are bigger and which numbers are smaller, with a focus on when the numbers have different amounts of digits.

## Literacy

This term in literacy we have been leaming about persua sive writing. We have been focussing on different persuasive texts and the language and techniques that are used to persuade the intended audience. As a class, we have been drafting a co-constructed letter to our principal to persuade herto read a book to ourclass. This has involved editing our letter to ensure it follows the correct structure a nd uses strong persuasive vocabulary.


## Numeracy

This term in maths we have been leaming about larger numbers and how to order them in ascending and descending order. We have been using place value ga mes and leaming activities to become more confident with large numbers as well as to consolidate our understanding by asking each other questions.
