NAPLAN results.

Last week all year 3 and 5 students should have received their NAPLAN results. How results are reported changed last year, so they may be different to what you remember.

Each student's individual report now shows how they're tracking against 4 levels of achievement, known as proficiency standards:

- ✓ Exceeding
- ✓ Strong
- ✓ Developing
- ✓ Needs additional support

NAPLAN results highlight a specific point in time. They're designed to help identify areas to focus on to support students' development. If you want to discuss your child's results please reach out.

Reading Checks

This term our year 1 and 2 students are involved in two mandatory DfE tests. The year 1 students will take part in the Phonics Screening Check. This is a valuable check on how students are progressing with letter sounds, blends and digraphs, using real and pseudo words. This is an important indicator of reading development. The year 2 students will take part in the new ORF (Oral Reading Fluency) check which measures the reading rate and accuracy of students reading. This is carried out across all year levels as it assists with identifying students who may need extra support.

We have a number of special events that are occurring in the next few weeks. Please keep an eye on all the communication platforms we use to keep up to date.

I am a proud Nurangga, Kurna, Ngarrindjeri woman and am still new to this role as I started this year down the road at Tapparra Primary school. In my short time at Tapparra, I have implemented change in their school by being a major part of the NAIDOC week celebrations with the idea of a Native Bush Barbeque. This was a remarkable success with multiple compliments on the day from families and community members who attended. I plan to have the same outcome at Craigmore South with events that get our community and families involved.

The reason I started in this role as an ACEO is to help with successful outcomes for young people and their families and to educate not only first nation's people but non-Aboriginal/Torres strait island peoples, on traditions, language, and cultural appropriation. I am hoping to learn more about first nations cultures from around Australia through the students and their families and share my own experiences along the way. I love chatting and am very down to earth and am looking forward to getting to know you all.

Term 3 Nurture Class 2024

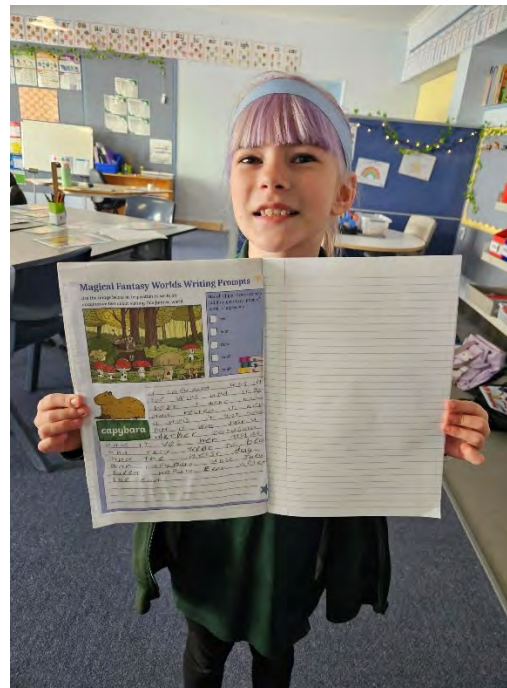
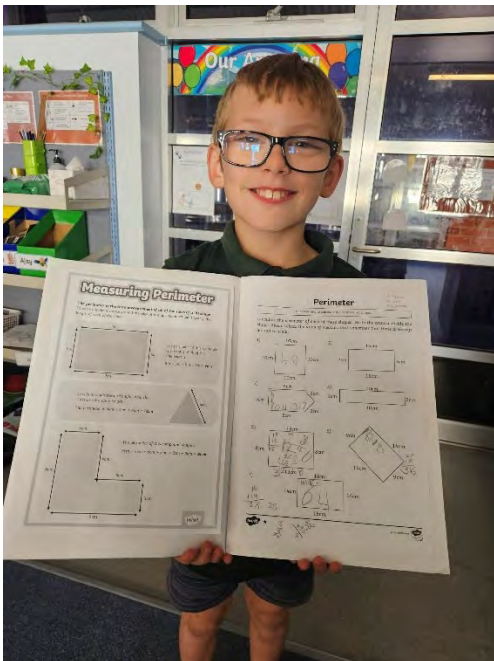
Term 3, the students of the Nurture Class have been looking at Area and Perimeter in maths lessons looking at various shapes as well as worded questions on the topic. Students have been using their whiteboards and working together to solve questions and their mathematical understanding.

Students have also been learning their times tables and being able to recall them to an adult during maths lessons. Students are in the process of learning the game buzz which is a multiplication game.

Students have enjoyed playing Numeracy Prodigy where they test their skills on all math areas covered. Students will continue learning the 4 operations in maths this term

In English this term, Students have had a strong focus on their phonics and are having weekly tests on their sounds and words. Students have been focusing on their punctuation and grammar and making sure they edit their work. Students have been focusing on Narrative writing this term and looking at what is included in a Narrative piece. Students have enjoyed reading to adults on their reading levels as well as going online to epic reading and listening to various books read to them. Students will be doing various assessments on Brightpath this term on Narrative writing and Information Reports.

In CPC this term students are working on expressing their emotions and feeling, as well as looking at strategies to stay in the green zone from break times and throughout the school day.

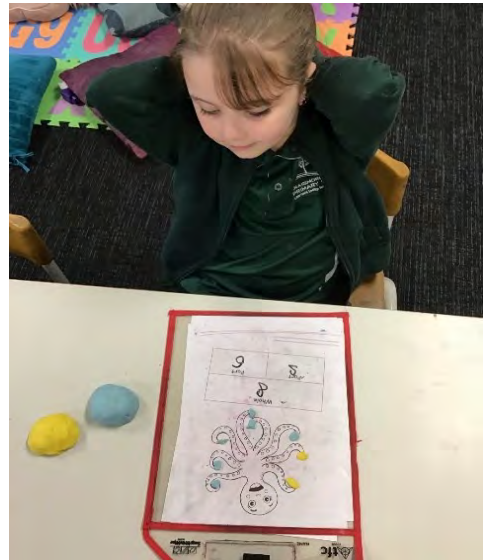
